## FROM THE RECTORY

Dear friends,

The days are “lengthening”, with brighter mornings and evenings. Hence the name of the church season of Lent and with the change of the hour from GMT to BST at the end of March (25<sup>th</sup> – 26<sup>th</sup>) we gain an extra hour of daylight in the evenings.

The cost to us of the clocks going forward is that we lose an hour’s sleep over the weekend. Back in 1752 the people of Britain rioted when they “lost” 11 days, when the government changed from the Julian calendar to the Gregorian calendar, and 2<sup>nd</sup> September was followed by 14<sup>th</sup> September the next day. This adjustment to the calendar was due to the way the date of Easter was calculated which was based on the 13 month lunar calendar, and too many leap year days in the century, such that dates and seasons were not quite synchronised. There were riots in some parts of the country with people claiming that they had had their lives shortened by a fortnight! I feel sad for the people who missed out on their birthdays that year!

Whatever the date or season, for some people time drags slowly while for others there is not enough time: “*I don’t know where this week has gone!*”

In 1963 Abbe Michael Quoist wrote *Prayers of Life*, including *Lord I have time*

*All men run after time, Lord  
they go through life running – hurried, jostled, overburdened, frantic,  
and they never get there.  
Lord, you must have made a mistake in your calculations.....  
there’s a big mistake somewhere.....  
the hours are too short; the days are too short; our lives are too short.*

*Lord I have time. I have plenty of time, all the years that you give me  
The years of my life, the days of my year, the hours of my days, they are all mine,  
mine to fill quietly, calmly but to fill up completely, up to the brim...  
To offer them to you, that of their insipid water  
You can make a rich wine such as you once made in Cana of Galilee.*

*I am not asking you, Lord, for the time to do this and that  
but your grace to do conscientiously in the time you have given me  
what you want me to do.*

Even for those with “time on their hands”, the closing lines invite us to give that time to God Lord of the seasons and of the years.

## BECKBURY PARISH COUNCIL

The Council met on Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> February 2017.

Progress on the Community Shop Project was reported to the Council, the full planning application has been submitted and a response is expected by 14<sup>th</sup> February. The Chairman reported that a new section of fence and new gate post had been installed on the entrance to the playing field – thanks to Solari Farms for their help.

David Cummings reported that a new set of updated draft rules and regulations had been prepared and submitted to the Allotments Committee for their consideration.

The Parish Council agreed to fund the registration of the team of defibrillator operators with the emergency services to improve the potential speed of response to a call out.

David Cummings reported on his discussions with Shropshire Council on the possible extension to the conservation area around Beckbury Village.

The Council approved funding for the school to send four pupils to the Bridgnorth and South Shropshire Crucial Crew event.

The Council considered three planning applications:

- Conversion of an agricultural building to a dwelling at Denton Pool – the Council agreed to register a strong objection
- The erection of a community shop adjacent to the village hall – the Council were fully supportive
- Tree trimming at Beckbury Cottage – no objections.

## **DOG OWNERS**

There have recently been numerous complaints about thoughtless dog owners leaving dog faeces on the ground rather than collecting it for deposit in bins.

The main areas for concern are:

**THE CHURCHYARD** – whilst there is a public footpath through the churchyard it is an offence to let dogs run free, fouling paths and also around the graves, please control your pets and clean up after them.

**STREETS**, including Higford Lane – this is the same problem as above and mainly affects parents with children and pushchairs, and people going out for a walk.

**PLAYING FIELD** – dogs are not allowed on the playing field, owners of dogs who let their dogs run on the field are liable to a maximum fine of £1,000.

**HORSE RIDERS** with dogs running free are breaking local by-laws which state that all dogs in our villages should be on leads, please control your dogs or leave them at home.

Whilst it is appreciated that the majority of dog owners are very responsible and caring, unfortunately it is just a small minority who are making it difficult for people to enjoy walking round the village.

**LITTER BINS** can be found at the corner of Higford Lane, in the village square and outside the school gates.

## **BECKBURY ALLOTMENTS**

### **MARCH TASKS ON THE ALLOTMENT**

The good news is that British summertime is nearly upon us and we can put the cold, wet February weather behind us. The clocks go forward on 26<sup>th</sup> March which means lighter nights and with a bit of luck some much needed sunshine.

Jobs to be getting on with:

- Last chance to prune fruit bushes and trees whilst they are still dormant. Not soft fruit though, their time is in the hot summer weather.
- Garlic grows best when exposed to a period of cold weather, so last chance to plant up a few bulbs.
- Plant out onion sets/shallots before they start to produce shoots. Reject any that have already started as they will only bolt during the summer.
- Sow celery, celeriac, french beans (they are hardy enough to be planted out before runners) and cauliflower.
- March is the right time to establish an asparagus bed. It's going to be there for many years so get the right position. Prepare the bed with plenty of drainage and keep weed free. Lawn cuttings are a good mulch.
- Mid-March you can plant out your chitted potatoes. If you want some really early spuds, you can start some in a black polythene sack in the polytunnel or greenhouse. Punch drainage holes and use multi-purpose compost.
- Jerusalem Artichokes tubers can be planted now. They are pretty invasive so make sure you dig them all up at harvest time. Any tubers left will grow again making it a permanent bed.
- Tomatoes, peppers, aubergines and cucumbers can be started off on a windowsill or propagator.
- Parsnips need to come up now before they start to regrow.
- Cover beds with cloches or black plastic to warm up the soil.
- Sow early celery, peas, broad beans and spinach.
- Finally my least favourite job.....weeding. Dig out problem weeds, especially perennials, and hoe regularly to prevent annual weeds.

Roll on the sunshine. Our seed packets are desperate to be opened!

## STOP PRESS NEWS



On Valentine's Day we got the news that the planning application for our Beckbury Community Shop, to be built next to the village hall, had been approved. Thanks to Paul Pleydell (Beckbury Cottage) and his team who have helped us with the preparation and submission of the application.

We have a firm quote for the building to be supplied by a company in Wem and Del Thomas (Woodthorne) has agreed to help us with the groundworks. We also have the promise of help with the internal fittings from a shop fitting company on Halesfield.

So our project is now really off and running, we just now need to raise the money to fund it all and we are looking at a target of around £25,000. There are plenty of grants around for community projects and Heather Thomas (No.64) has already started with the applications. The shop is formally registered as a "Community Benefit Society" with the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) and this allows us to raise funding locally by launching a Community Share scheme. By buying shares in the shop, £10 per share, you can also have a say in how the shop is run and help make it a success.

Over the next month members of our shop committee will be delivering a leaflet to each household to explain this and invite people to participate. In the meantime we have attached a copy of the application form to the back of the Parish Newsletter.

A community shop in the village will benefit us all, so please help us to raise the funding to make it happen.
