FROM THE RECTORY

Dear friends,

In our Six Parishes Sunday services rota you will see mention of *lammas*. This has become a regular part of our annual cycle of services, so most of you will remember that it is one of the four traditional farming services in the year.

Lammas means *loaf mass*, and it was the service marking the start of the harvest and so fresh bread with new flour. Traditionally the first loaf was taken to church as a 'thanksgiving offering', genuinely meant because bread made before the first cereal harvest may have been made with poor flour from mouldy corn or with added extras like old acorns to make the dwindling supply of flour go further.

Expectations for this year's harvest seem to be good. But in our global economy the richer nations can always buy in cereals from elsewhere. Centuries ago things were much more local and a poor harvest affected the villages and towns till the following year. Today we can import food from around the world, and so the majority of people in the UK do not realise the network of factors that affect UK harvest and food production.

One of those perennial factors is the weather. While we know how it affects our personal plans, trips and holidays, we may forget that it is a prime element in crop growth production and harvest. This factor remains relatively unchanged for farmers today as centuries ago.

In our lammas service there is a prayer when the freshly baked barley loaf is broken for sharing among the congregation.

Blessed are you Lord God of creation: Through your goodness we have this bread which earth has given and which human hands have made

This nicely acknowledges the work and efforts of farmers, millers and bakers, but also those other factors like the weather. Ultimately we come together to give thanks to God for being creator and provider, especially in the harvest hymn

To thee, O Lord, our hearts we raise in hymns of adoration......

And now on this our festal day, thy bounteous hand confessing Upon thine altar, Lord, we lay the first fruits of thy blessing

The language is Victorian, but the sentiments still hold true for us today.

BECKBURY PARISH COUNCIL

The Council met on Wednesday 7th June 2017 in Beckbury Village Hall. It was a quiet meeting as all the focus was on the events of the following day, the General Election

The council discussed the playing fields and how well they are looking at the moment, and that they are being used on a regular basis. The council were informed that there are several events being planned over the next few months which will be open to all in the village to take part. The playing fields are currently maintained on a regular basis by Peter Glaze and his grandson Reid, and we extend our thanks for the work they are doing.

The police are asking for everyone to be vigilant at the current time and if you do have any concerns or see anything suspicious then contact 101 or if it is an emergency call 999.

Members of the community have raised concerns of parking outside the telephone kiosk in Caynton Road. It has been observed that some vehicles are completely blocking the pavement which is stopping people from using it. There is also an issue that has been raised with the parking in Lawton Close, some people are parking their vehicles right on the junction causing an obstruction and stopping people from safely crossing the road. We ask that vehicle owners show consideration for other people who are using the pavements. Blocking a Public Footpath and parking directly on the junction of a road are offences which are both enforceable by Fixed Penalty Tickets.
