FROM THE RECTORY

What will you be doing?

Dear friends,

February 14th has an unusual clash of 'festivals'. Most recognise the date as St Valentine's Day the patron saint of love, romance and marriage. He was a priest in Rome, who secretly married young church couples during the reign of the Roman Emperor Claudius (260AD) who outlawed anyone who helped Christians. February 14th has now evolved into a day for expressing love, and nowadays it conveniently fills the gap between Christmas and Easter for the commercial world.

This year February 14th is also Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. This was traditionally a day of penitence and fasting, with very different customs to those associated with St Valentine's Day.

It is a safe bet that Valentine will win the day, and chocolates and sweets will be eaten, romantic meals enjoyed and not a sign of fasting or the old fashioned "sackcloth and ashes" indicating giving up the "pleasures of the world".

Ash Wednesday might seem to be the opposite of love, certainly for those who subscribe to the catchphrase "Love means never having to say you're sorry". This was a line from the Erich Segal novel Love Story and popularised by the 1970 film adaptation starring Ali MacGraw and Ryan O'Neal. I am not sure how many of you would agree with it?

Lent can be a time for reflection and assessment of how we are getting on with those two great commandments of loving God and loving our neighbour. Somewhere or other we all fall short of those high ideals, and acknowledge the place for apology – or saying sorry.

We actually know very little about Valentine. But among the stories told is one about his execution by Emperor Claudius who commanded that Valentine either renounce his faith or be beaten with clubs, and beheaded. Valentine refused and he was executed in Rome on February 14th, 269AD.

Valentine loved his Lord too much to deny and renounce him. His was not a gentle romantic love, but rather total devotion and commitment. That has become lost in today's Valentine Day traditions. I wonder what he would make of the way his day is celebrated today.

BECKBURY ALLOTMENTS

Happy New Year! As we welcome 2018 through the door there are plenty of things to look forward to as a vegetable grower. Maybe try your hand at growing something more unusual. Last year it was melons for me and with great success. This year will be the year of the Mooli...

January/February is renowned for being a mixed bag of weather. From grey miserable days with persistent rain and sleet to bright sunny ones that lure us into thinking winter is over. But there is light at the end of the 'poly' tunnel. You can start sowing a few crops such as certain varieties of chillies, aubergines, broad beans and tomatoes, and if you desire very early potatoes you can begin to grow these in containers undercover.

Other jobs to be getting on with:

- Provided the ground is not frozen or water-logged you can complete your winter digging and incorporate as much organic matter as you can
- You can dig up and divide rhubarb
- Plant out soft fruit bushes
- If you have outdoor peaches make a polythene shelter to protect from peach leaf curl
- Harvest leeks, parsnips, cabbage and Brussel sprouts
- Chit seed potatoes
- Plant shallots and garlic
- Broad beans can be sown directly outside
- Jerusalem artichokes remember they grow mighty tall and can over-shadow other crops when they reach full height.

So although the plot may look a little bare there is still plenty to get on with.
