## FROM THE RECTORY

Dear friends,

Here is a quiz night question for you: what was Queen Anne's Bounty? And in keeping with quiz nights the answer comes at the end!

Queen Elizabeth II is head of the Church of England, but the arrangements for providing salaries for the clergy is very different now to how it was in Queen Anne's time. Clergy "stipends" (as our salaries are called, a word which strangely comes from old Latin meaning a soldier's pay or a tax!) are now paid by the dioceses. In my case this is the Diocese of Lichfield, whose budget of £15 million includes income from its churches and congregations. These contributions are called "parish shares" and make up nearly 70% of the total diocesan income. From this, £12.5 million goes to clergy housing, salaries and pensions.

But as with so many business and family budgets, costs rise while income decreases. The Church of England does not sell a product like businesses, though weddings and funerals may be seen by some as such. There are fewer weddings and funerals taken by the Church year on year with other options and venues available and also with society's changing beliefs and practices. The Church is not a business but a charity, and depends mainly on voluntary donations. These are our "parish shares" made up of voluntary Sunday gifts and collections and also with fund raising by local church members. Our six churches contribute a total of £39,000 though it is estimated that the cost of having a vicar (with training; house; pension; salary; diocesan support) is about £55,000.

Our 2015 AGMs showed that four of our Six Parishes were in deficit last year and had to use reserves to balance the accounts. Budgets range from £6,000 to £11,000 for running costs, without major repairs or improvement projects. Our churches cannot keep on using up their reserves.

So my letter this month is an appeal to parishioners to consider either making regular donations to your local church (and thanks to those who already do) or consider making arrangements to leave a legacy in your will. One church in our deanery has recently received a very generous legacy from a resident which will enable the church council, not only to cover shortfalls in its annual running costs for many years to come, but also to look at improvements to its church building and facilities.

*Queen Anne's Bounty was a scheme set up in 1704 to supplement the income of poorer clergy, at a time when there was no standard salary, but a variety of parish incomes which made some clergy very well off and others very poor.*

## **BECKBURY PARISH COUNCIL**

The Council met on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> May.

Mark Spickernell attended the open to public section of the meeting to report on Beckbury Allotments and discuss proposed developments.

The Council re-elected Messrs Gibbins and Steventon as Chairman and Vice-Chairman for the next 12 months. The Parish Council annual accounts for 2015/16 were presented and approved by the meeting.

The Community Shop Committee had met on 7<sup>th</sup> April and a follow up meeting was arranged for 5<sup>th</sup> May to agree how to take the project forward.

Latest forecast on the village connection to fibre broadband is that it will still go live before the summer.

The Council noted that the pothole at the entrance to Brook Farm, Madeley Road and the deep passing place on Badger Road had both been repaired since the last meeting.

Work has commenced on the creation of a new web site for Beckbury as part of the Government's policy of encouraging Councils to be more transparent.

## **PARKING ON PAVEMENTS**

You may have seen this issue on the national news recently, featured as an increasing problem in major cities, and parking on pavements has actually been illegal in London for over 40 years. However, elsewhere it is not illegal although driving on the pavement has been since 1835 when a ban was introduced against riding on “any horse, ass, sheep, mule, swine, or cattle or carriage of any description, or any truck or sledge” along paths meant for pedestrians.

The Parish Council has recently been getting complaints of the problem in our village. It is a frequent complaint from parents walking children to school, often with prams and being forced out into the road at a busy time for traffic.

So can we please appeal to all drivers to be more considerate and to avoid parking on the pavement whenever possible, particularly where there is room to safely park in the road?

Each garden will be someone's favourite.




