#### **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOEBOX APPEAL 2016**

On 28<sup>th</sup> November, a container lorry, filled with shoe boxes full of toys, sweets and cuddly toys, set off from Telford, on its long journey to reach boys and girls in Kyrgyzstan, in Central Asia. A further vanload (1,000+) went to join those collected by the Dudley warehouse, and would likely be sent out to Romania.

Volunteers at the Telford warehouse processed a brilliant **5,712** shoe boxes and at the Shrewsbury warehouse, a fabulous **3,685**. This year OCC have purchased the container which will stay in Kyrgyzstan – and it will probably be used to provide shelter for three or four families.

I don't know who wrote the following piece but it reminds me why so many of us are involved with shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child.

Imagine a child, for who there is no hope, for who life has very little joy. Imagine the child who has had her home torn away and whose childhood is forgotten in the desperate need for the family to find shelter, food, and to stay alive. Imagine the child who lives in poverty, orphaned or alone, or the child in an institution, fed and clothed but without personal possessions and no family to call their own. It is these children that Operation Christmas Child exists for, it is these children that you stand in the cold, or drive vans, count money and cheques or scour the shop sales for. It is for these children that God sent Jesus. If our hearts break for these children, God's heart breaks all the more. What you do is bring hope, you allow a child to be a child for a few moments, to feel loved, treasured, remembered.

On behalf of the Telford Team, thank you to everyone who joined in this year's appeal, and I wish you all a very Happy Christmas and a peaceful New Year.

#### **BECKBURY ALLOTMENTS**

With the festive season over January is a good time to relax with a garden book, seed catalogue and pen and paper. It's a new year and there's no better time to learn from the previous season and plan improvements and what new to grow.

However, if weather permits there are a few jobs to be getting on with:

- Bonfire rubbish
- Order seeds
- Plan veg beds
- Winter prune fruit bushes (not stone fruit)
- Force rhubarb
- Wash down greenhouses and polytunnels with Citrox (a natural disinfectant made from citrus fruits)
- Also containers, seed trays and potting bench (prevents pests and disease at the propagation stage)
- Prune grapes. This job was traditionally carried out on New Year's Day
- Ensure that the wheelbarrow doesn't have a flat tyre!

So, although the allotment may look a little bare there is plenty to be getting on with if you can drag yourself away from the warmth of your fire. If anyone is interested in taking on a plot there is one available 2017. Please contact Mark Spickernell (allotment chairman) on 07870621720.

#### **BECKBURY TRAIL**



On 19<sup>th</sup> November the second running of the Lawley Running Clubs Beckbury Trail, a 5.6 mile trail run, took place. This year we had 300 entrants for the event, the runners descended on Beckbury to pick up their race number from the village hall, then down to the start on Higford Lane. The race started promptly at 11am with the runners taking on the challenging but rewarding course. First male to cross the line was Christian Evan in a new course record of 35:11 and the first female to finish was Beckbury's **Luci Tait-Harris**, who also broke the female record in a time of 41:43. The race also managed to raise over £1,800 for local good causes, including Wolverhampton, Telford, Shrewsbury and Bridgnorth food banks, as well as Beckbury Village Hall and the ATC.

We were extremely happy with the competitors' comments about this year's race, with one competitor saying "the course was stunning, the marshals were fantastic and the overall race spectacular". We at Lawley Running Club feel that we can showcase the area in this way.

The date for next year's race has been set for 19<sup>th</sup> November 2017, where we shall be reintroducing the Villagers Trophy for the first person to finish from the surrounding area.
