## Criminals impersonate police in fake investigation fraud

We are warning people, particularly the elderly, to be wary of a growing fraud in which criminals pose as police officers and ask their victims to take part in a fake undercover operation.

Seventeen offences have been reported to us with two losses totalling approximately £20,000. Four further reports were reported directly to Action Fraud but did not report a loss.

Fraudsters are contacting the public, usually by phone, claiming to be from the police, or in some cases their bank's fraud team. They claim they are investigating a fraud at a local bank branch where staff are suspected of being complicit, including issuing fake bank notes, and ask their target to help in the operation.

As part of the fraud, the individual is asked to visit their bank and withdraw a considerable sum, often thousands of pounds, of the supposedly counterfeit cash to hand over to the 'police' for analysis. The victim is assured that the money will be put back into their account after the operation is complete. However, once the money is passed over the fraudster disappears with the cash.

Detective Inspector Rob Harvmann, of the force's Fraud and Financial Investigation Unit said: "Fraudsters will use whatever way they can to get people to believe in them. Impersonating a bank official or a police officer reinforces that belief.

"It's important to remember neither the bank nor the police will cold call you asking you to act on their behalf. Be vigilant, do not engage in conversation, put the phone down and tell someone you trust. If you have been a victim of such a fraud and you have handed money to someone, please contact 101 or Action Fraud."

- The police will never ask you to become part of an undercover investigation or for you to withdraw cash and hand it to them for safe-keeping.
- Be wary of any calls, texts or emails purporting to be from the police asking for your personal or financial details, or for you to transfer money.

# Warwickshire Rural Watch Bulletin - 29 November 2017

Please be aware of the following incidents, which have occurred at farms and rural businesses, across Warwickshire, over recent days:

Incident 132 of 17 November - Curdworth: During the night of 16 into 17 November, offenders entered a stable yard in Marsh Lane, Curdworth by cropping the padlock off the main gate. Once inside the yard, the offenders stole a secure blue Iveco horsebox.

Incident 205 of 21 November - Fillongley: During the night of 20 into 21 November, offenders entered the yard of a farm premises in Green End Road, Fillongley and stole the batteries from three tractors and a front loader.

Incident 71 of 22 November - Winderton: During the night of 21 into 22 November, offenders stole a caravan from the yard of a farm premises in Winderton, Banbury after removing the wheel clamp and Hitchlock.

Incident 66 of 23 November - Ryton on Dunsmore: During the night of 22 into 23 November, offenders entered a farm premises in Ryton on Dunsmore and then accessed a building through the roof. Once inside, the offenders carried out a search and used a fork lift truck in an attempt to remove a safe. Damage was caused but the offenders failed to make off with the safe.

Incident 42 of 23 November - Warton: At just before 5am on 23 November, offenders stole a Lunar Delta caravan from a farm premises in Warton Lane, Warton.

Incident 248 of 24 November - Ansley: Between 8 and 10am on 24 November, offenders entered a brick built workshop at a farm premises in Ansley and stole power tools including a petrol driven Stihl disc cutter, a Topcon laser level and hand tools.

Incident 159 of 27 November - Exhall: During the night of 26 into 27 November, offenders entered the yard of a farm premises in Exhall, Alcester and then stole
